

In early 2021 Vincent and Daniel began searching for office space in New York City. They settled on a property located at 352 Seventh Avenue. After a brief renovation, furniture and recording equipment was acquired and the space was turned into a combined office and recording studio.

Podcasts and videos are recorded and produced in a separate space that can be easily reconfigured for single or multiple-person productions. Within the studio is also an intimate seating area for one-one discussions with our in-studio guests.

A second part of The Incubator is a large office space, where the painting *Ebola* has been installed. There is a large table for conferences, a separate library area with bookshelves filled with reading material covering all aspects of the life sciences, chairs and a lamp for reading. A small kitchen and office complete this area.
